1. Arrival in Thailand

All non-Thai nationals must complete the Thailand Digital Arrival Card (TDAC) before entering the country. The TDAC replaces the former paper-based arrival card and is mandatory for all travellers entering via air, land, or sea.

Submission timeline: The TDAC must be completed within 3 days before your arrival in Thailand.

How to submit:

1. Visit tdac.immigration.go.th
2. Select individual registration
3. Fill in personal details
4. Review and confirm your information
5. Download the confirmation (QR code or reference number)

Upon arrival, you will need to present the QR code or reference number to the immigration officer.

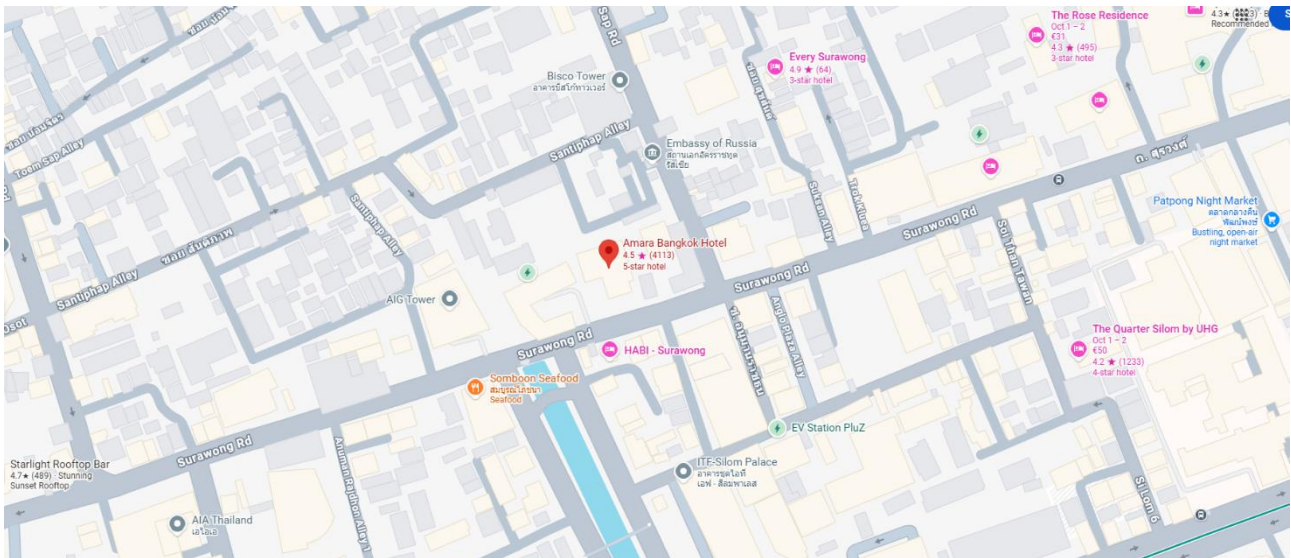
Important notes:

- The TDAC is not a visa. If you require a visa to enter Thailand, please obtain it separately in advance.

2. Event venue and accommodation

The event will take place at the Amara Bangkok hotel ([180/1 Surawong Road Sipraya, Bangrak, Bangkok 10500 Thailand](#)).





Registration is scheduled to start from 9:00 a.m. daily.

Participants joining from outside Bangkok are welcome to book accommodation at the same venue. To do so, please contact Tawisa Schmid - tawisa.s@amarahotels.com and reference the event for a special rate. Please note that accommodation costs remain the responsibility of individual participants and are not covered by the event organizers.

3. Meals

Lunch and coffee breaks as well as food during the welcome reception will be provided to all participants on days where the program is ongoing.

4. Weather in Bangkok

The weather in early September is typically hot and humid, with daytime temperatures ranging from 28 °C to 35 °C. This period falls within the rainy season, so occasional heavy showers – often short-lived but intense – are to be expected, particularly in the afternoons and evenings. Humidity levels are high throughout.

During the dialogue sessions, please be aware that meeting rooms will be air-conditioned, so a light layer for indoors may be useful.

5. Safety and security

Thailand is generally a safe country to travel and work in. However, common crimes such as pickpocketing and scams can occur, especially in busy areas and tourist zones. Always keep your belongings secure, avoid leaving valuables unattended, and remain vigilant in crowded places.

To ensure your health and safety:



- Do not accept unsolicited help or offers from strangers, even if they come from your home country or speak your language.
- Use only metered taxis and follow your route on Google Maps.
- Avoid walking alone at night in unfamiliar areas, and do not display expensive jewellery or valuables.
- Never leave your credit card out of sight when making payments and double-check transaction amounts.
- Maintain safe food habits and drink bottled water. Ensure to consume water, ice and food from trusted sources only.
- Exercise caution when trying street food, but vendors with high customer traffic are generally a safe and reliable choice.

Furthermore, avoid illegal substances entirely. Drug laws are strictly enforced in Thailand, with severe penalties. Public consumption of cannabis is prohibited. Drink responsibly and never leave drinks unattended. Stay away from demonstrations and political gatherings and be respectful of the monarchy. Thailand's lèse-majesté laws are strictly enforced. Do not take photos of military or police installations and ask permission before photographing people.

Always carry a valid ID with you. Store important documents in a hotel safe and inform a colleague or contact of your travel plans.

6. Vaccines

Travellers to Bangkok are advised to ensure that routine vaccinations such as measles mumps-rubella (MMR), diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis and polio are up to date. Additionally, vaccines for hepatitis A and typhoid are recommended, as these diseases can be contracted through contaminated food or water. Please consult your healthcare provider or a travel medicine clinic well in advance of your trip to receive tailored advice.

7. Adapters



In Thailand, almost all power sockets are hybrid (see picture) and are compatible with power outlets of type A, B, C and O. The standard voltage is 230 V with a frequency of 50 Hz. You may need a plug adapter and possibly a voltage converter if your devices are not compatible with 230 V. We highly recommend you bring an international adapter, in case your plugs should not be compatible.
